

The Society Marks Its Second Year

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

As we approach the end of our second year, this is a good time to assess the accomplishments of the past year.

From a start as a group of about six concerned citizens, we have grown to a membership of 231. The restoration of the Doctors' House which brought us together is advancing steadily toward completion under the able leadership of Marie Luft. The goals we established two years ago, to preserve and promote Glendale's architecture and history, are being met.

Community awareness of our historic resources is increasing with the extensive publicity we have received in the local media, our newsletter, our tours, our speakers' bureau, our monthly programs, our historical cookbook publication, and our encouragement and acceptance of the co-operation of other local organizations.

To provide assistance to those interested in preserving and restoring historic or architecturally fine structures, we have created a file of experts and resources in various kinds of restoration work, from paint scraping to milling of decorative wood work. We have available a resume providing tax incentive information for the restoration of historic structures. We have begun a program to comprehensively survey the architectural and historic features of Glendale.

We have been active in encouraging an alternative to the destruction of the Egyptian Village Cafe by speaking with the Redevelopment Agency, and by communicating with the owner and developer of the project, which includes the Jensen Building and the Cafe.

Now is a good time to look forward!

We look forward to the use of \$80,000.00 in Community Block Grant Development funds which will help complete the restoration of the exterior of the Doctors' House.

We hope to see our membership double in the coming year, and to increase our fundraising capacity in order to carry out our programs.

We plan to continue to expand the community's awareness of our history and architecture, using successful programs like those of the past year as well as trying new ones. We hope to involve trained volunteers in the architectural survey program; to make recommendations to local, state and federal agencies for the recognition of significant structures and features; to increase our ability to provide

technical assistance to the community; to become more involved in encouraging the Redevelopment Agency to preserve our historic resources by continuing to speak for the preservation of the Egyptian Village Cafe, the Alex Theatre, and the Masonic Building; and, if necessary, to act as an intermediary to promote the preservation of the Goode House.

The year ahead promises to be as full of issues, work and fulfillment as the last.
